TODAY'S MASS READINGS

First Reading -- I will put enmity between your offspring and her offspring. Genesis 3:9–15

Responsorial Psalm -- “With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.” Psalm 130

Gospel Reading -- It is the end of Satan. Mark 3:20–35

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

Moved by the Holy Spirit, we gather today as a family—a parish family as well as children of God—to celebrate the Eucharist. It is appropriate to think of our family of faith, for in the Gospel today we hear Jesus tell the crowds that whoever does the will of God is a part of his family. We may not always be conscious of our closeness to the Lord, so let us pray that we may come to recognize the gift that allows us to be sisters and brothers of Jesus as we do our best to do God’s will.

Original sin drove a wedge between humanity and God. Adam and Eve were banished from paradise, their home in Eden. But as we sing in the psalm, with God there is mercy and redemption. Indeed, Paul teaches us that while our earthly dwelling—our bodies—may waste away, our heavenly dwelling awaits. In the Gospel, Jesus assures us that whoever follows God’s will is brother and sister to him. Let us listen to God’s word as part of God’s family.

Hope at the End of the Struggle

“Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age . . . with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come” (Mark 10:29–30). The above words of Christ from Mark’s Gospel tie our readings together by reminding us that both trial and hope coexist in this life.

As we read about the Fall of man, we are reminded of the grave sin of Adam and Eve. Their sin ushers in a long age of shame, darkness, and confusion, marked by enmity between mankind and the devil. The dejection resulting from this punishment is expressed by the psalmist, who says, “If you, O Lord, mark iniquities, Lord, who can stand?” (Ps 130:3). The state of sin in which man finds himself bears bitter fruit in the attitude of the scribes toward Jesus, who blaspheme the Holy Spirit by attributing the works of Christ to Satan.

Despite this depravity, our readings are also full of hope. At the end of the account of the Fall, God promises a Savior: “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike at your head, while you strike at his heel” (Gen 3:15). This has been seen from the beginning of the Church as a veiled reference to the privileged “offspring” of “the woman,” Jesus, the son of the New Eve, Mary. He will fight Satan and crush his head. Even in the depths of original sin, we will receive a Savior.

The psalmist, too, does not stop with darkness. “But with you is forgiveness, that you may be revered” (Ps. 130:4). St. Paul, while describing his body as “wasting away,” describes his inner self as “being renewed day by day,” awaiting “a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven” (2 Cor 4:16; 5:1). And Jesus, despite hatred and rejection, rejoices in the kinship of those who do the will of the Father: “Here are my mother and my brothers” (Mark 3:34).

This complex picture reflects the dramatic journey of the saints toward heaven. In this life, we are corrupted by sin, weakened by the battle between light and darkness, weighed down by our iniquities, tempted to reject the love of God. Even when we sacrifice house, brothers, sisters, and all the rest for Jesus and the Gospel, we are to expect the hundredfold “with persecutions.” But at the end of it all is the promise of forgiveness for the contrite of heart, the promise of the victory of Christ over the offspring of the serpent, the promise of an eternal dwelling with Our Lord in heaven.

High School Tuition Discounts

Catholic High Schools normally have two tuition rates, one for ACTIVE Catholics and another for non-Catholics or inactive Catholics.

For example, at Monsignor Edward Pace High School, the tuition rate is as follows:

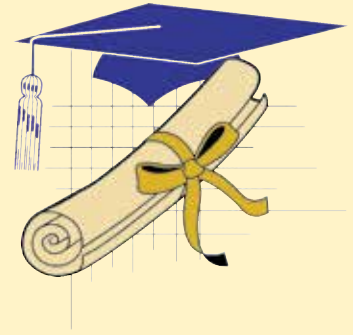
Active Catholics	\$12,950
Others	\$13,950

An additional discount is available to families who substantially support their parish. The definition of substantial varies but if the parish has a grade school, the amount of the support to local parish cannot be less than that required to obtain a tuition discount at the parish grade school.

To qualify for a tuition discount (In-Parish rate) at St. Bartholomew Catholic School, a contribution to the Church of \$75 per month is required. Therefore, in order for us to sign off for you to obtain an additional discount at a Catholic High School, you must have contributed \$900 to St Bartholomew Church in the previous calendar year (2023).

Advice to graduates

It's graduation season and if there's one thing that's synonymous with commencement ceremonies, it's lots of advice. Commencement speakers love to share timeless wisdom such as, make your bed every morning or never hit the snooze button. I would certainly never give advice I don't try to follow myself (hence why I wouldn't give anyone the aforementioned advice!)

Yet, on the eve of my oldest son's high school graduation, I have been reflecting a lot on all the things I want to say as he launches into this new phase of life. But the truth is, though I am apt to dole out advice to graduates, some of the advice I share here are reminders that I need regularly as well:

- Your worth is not defined by the college you attend, how much money you make, or the job title you hold. Your worth is defined by God alone and the ultimate prize is heaven.
- Study hard in school, work hard at your job and in your classes but above all, be a student of life. Your biggest lessons won't be learned inside a classroom, but in the school of life.
- Don't lose sight of the person God made you to be. What are the talents God gave you that help make you unique? Ask God to help show you how you can use these talents to serve others to help you discover your vocation.
- Make wise choices. Tap into those gifts of the Holy Spirit that you were given at Confirmation to help guide and inspire your choices. And if you make a poor choice (you will!), get back up and try again. You don't always choose what happens to you, but you can choose how you react to it.
- We live in a culture of entitlement, but nothing is deserved in this life. Anything that is freely given is a gift from God who loves you as His beloved child and gives you all good things, unmerited, that you might come to know Him better.
- If you ever question or stray from the faith, go back to basics. Ask questions but look for the answers. Read the Bible. Pick up the Catechism. And ask God to multiply your faith.
- Choose friends who help you get closer to heaven. Look to the saints as well. They are our friends in heaven and learning how they lived their lives can help us in our own walk toward happiness and holiness.
- Remember the words of St. John Paul II: "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; he is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you..."
- Strive for the narrow road. Don't get swept up in the wave of mediocrity.
- Speak up when you see injustice. Don't just think that someone else will do it. You might be the one God is calling to give voice to the voiceless.
- Listen. Process. Think before speaking. Use common sense. Be flexible.
- Be kind and charitable. Extend mercy and forgiveness to others. Everyone is bearing their own crosses.
- You don't have it all figured out right now (contrary to what you might think!) And you're not going to have life all figured out when you're in college either. Nor 5 years later. Nor 20 years later. Nor 40 years later. We continue growing and learning.
- Be patient with your parents. We are learning to let go and learning to parent young adult children. We will get it wrong sometimes. You will get frustrated - so will we. But we are trying and will always be here to love you, pray for you, challenge you and support you.

You don't have to follow my advice. But, my beloved son, my goddaughter, and all graduates:

***J* do encourage you to follow *Jesus*.**
